Admission Requirements

To Apply to the Nursing Program:

- · Possess a high-school diploma or GED certificate.
- Achieve at least a B- in ALL prerequisite courses:
- Anatomy & Physiology I w/ Lab (BIO 126/BIO 127)
- College Composition (ENG 101)**
- Quantitative Reasoning or Statistics (MAT 118 or MAT 124) or College Algebra (MAT 127)
- Introduction to Psychology (PSY 101)*
- TEAS test score of 60 or higher.
- Attend a MANDATORY information session.
- Two Letters of Recommendation
- ➤ AP and/or CLEP credits will be accepted for College Composition, Introduction to Psychology, and Psychology Across the Lifespan. Math and Science prerequisites must be completed within seven years (January 1, 2018 to May 31, 2025) TEAS test scores must be from within the past 3 years (Feb. 2022 to Feb. 2025). All prerequisites for Fall 2025 applicants need to be completed by May 31, 2024. Applicants are responsible for ensuring all pre-requisites are appropriately met. - > Final acceptance is based on result of criminal background check, prior to beginning the program and then annually.

General Requirements

To meet the Nursing Program Student Learning Outcomes, applicants must have the following independent abilities and skills:

- Ability to identify cyanosis, absence of respiratory movement in patients; Ability to determine and understand small print on medication containers, physicians' orders, monitors, and equipment calibrations.
- Ability to understand the normal speaking voice without viewing the speaker's face; hear monitor alarms, emergency signals, call bells from patients and telephone orders; take/ hear blood pressure, heart, lung, vascular, and abdominal sounds with stethoscope.
- Ability to remain in a stationary position for prolonged periods of time, perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation, transfer, move, and reposition patients, and move from room to room or maneuver in limited spaces.
- Ability to communicate clearly and succinctly when explaining treatment procedures, describing patient's conditions, and implementing health teaching. Notate legibly and correctly in patient's chart for local documentation.
- Ability to use sterile techniques to insert catheter, withdraw blood, and prepare medications / administer medications (oral and parenteral routes).
- Ability to palpate pulses, determine warmth and coolness, detect enlarged nodes and lumps.
- Ability to function safely under stressful conditions and the ability to adapt to an ever-changing environment inherent in clinical situations involving patient care.
- Consistent with the requirements of state and federal law, the College provides reasonable accommodations for students

Health Requirements

The applicant must submit proof to the Nursing Program of the following:

- MMR: Measles, Mumps, Rubella An official record of an immune titer must be provided for each
- HBV: Hepatitis B: 3 Doses An official record of an immune titer must be provided following completion of the series.
- TD: Adult Tetanus and Pertussis (TDaP) An official record of immunization within the past 10 years must be provided.
- PPD: Purified Protein Derivative (TB) Annual testing is required. If applicant has not been tested within the past year, initial
 testing must consist of 2 tests not more than three weeks apart. Applicants with a history of a positive skin test should
 contact the Nursing Department Chair
- Varicella (Chicken Pox) An official record of an immune titer must be provided.

Additional requirements may include:

- COVID-19 immunization
- Annual influenza immunization

Upon acceptance to the YCCC Nursing Program, students will have additional non-academic requirements:.

- Laptop
- Uniforms
- Professional Healthcare Provider Basic Life Support certification (American Heart Association)
- Students must provide their own transportation to and from clinical setting

Nursing majors must follow the NUR course sequence and achieve a minimum grade of 77 or a C+ (with a satisfactory clinical grade) in order to progress from one nursing course to another. Students must adhere to the nursing program attendance requirements or it may result in dismissal from the program. Students may be allowed to repeat one nursing course by reapplying to the program and, dependent on full faculty vote and available space within course, students may be readmitted. Completion of all Nursing courses with a grade of C+ or better is required to graduate.
